GENERAL RULES

APPLEATCHEE GROUND RULES MUST BE OBSERVED.
 Rules are posted on the grounds at various locations.

DOGS: Please leave your dogs at home, if possible. Dogs on the show grounds *must be controlled on a leash*, confined to vehicles, or crated at all times. A 'donation' of \$50.00 will be required to free an impounded canine.

STALLIONS: No stallions over the age of 18 months may be stabled or ridden on the ground except during sponsored events, and must be handled by an Adult 18y.o. or over.

CONDUCT: Show Management reserves the right to refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer or rider who has demonstrated unsportsmanlike behavior at a Appeatchee Show or to its Management.

Competition Tests:

Introductory tests will be the **2015 USDF** tests.

All Training Level and above tests, including rider tests, will be the **2015 USEF** tests.

Eventing dressage tests will be the **2018 USEA** tests.

Western tests will be the **2017 WDAA** tests.

Test of Choice Classes: There will be no changes to Test of Choice classes after entry closing date

Judge's decision in all classes is final: No one shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain permission from the Show Secretary who will arrange an appointment at a proper place and time.

Attire and Tack: Refer to WSH rule book for specific show attire and tack. Depending on weather, **Judges may** wave wearing Jackets. All English and Jr. riders must wear ASTM approved helmets.

Post Entries: Management reserves the right to accept post entries if space allows. There will be a post entry fee of **\$10.00** per class.

Ride Times: A ride schedule will be emailed to **each rider** after the closing date. If ride times are not received, it is the responsibility of the rider/owner to contact Show Management. Any changes in Time Schedule will be posted outside the SHOW OFFICE. Tentative start times will be **8am each day**.

Refunds:

A) Refunds BEFORE CLOSING day less \$10 Secretary fee.

B) Refunds AFTER CLOSING DATE allowed only upon presentation of a veterinarian's or doctors certificate. Otherwise, no refunds of entries or stabling after closing date unless there is a waiting list for the stall/ride and the space can be filled from a waiting list at least 5 days prior to day of competition.

C) A \$10 Secretary fee **will be deducted** from all refunds made after the closing date.

Services:

Concessions on the grounds during show hours.

First Aid assistance is available on grounds.

Veterinarian and Farriers numbers will be posted in show office.

Classes are the same for: Saturday and Sunday

Show Office: Located inside the large MAIN indoor arena. Open one hour prior to first class, and will close one-half hour after the last class.

Barn chart: will be posted at the office and stalls will be marked.

Accuracy of Scores: It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of scores. Any scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary and/or the assistant within two hours of the last ridden test for that class. Failure to report any errors within the time allowed will mean that the error will not be corrected and there will be no change in class placing.

Awards: Trophies for classes of three (3) entered exhibitors or more. Ribbons to five places.

High Percentage Awards:

- 1) Jr/Young Rider English and Western,
- 2) Adult Amateur English and Western,
- 3) Adult Open. English and Western,

RIDERS MUST BE PRE-ENTERED TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR HIGH PT. AWARDS.

Arena: All tests will be ridden indoors, on dirt/sand footing. USEA, WDAA, and USDF Intro classes will use 20M X 40M arena. All other classes will use a 20M X 60M arena.

There is a covered warm up arena. One additional outdoor arena is available for warm up and lungeing.

Closing date of entries: Friday May 24, 2018, unless the show becomes over-subscribed, in which case entries will be limited and will be accepted as received.

Telephone/emailed entries will not be accepted.

Any changes in entry require a new entry form.

Management reserves the right to add a \$5 secretary fee for changes in schedule after ride times have been mailed.

Combination of Classes: The show management reserves the right to cancel or combine (where less than three horses are entered), or divide classes, or change order for award purposes.

Classes listed will be scheduled at the discretion of the Show Management. ***Competitors will be notified of class schedule by email.***

DIRECTIONS:

From West: US 2, enter on Wenatchee Ave., right on Miller St. to the very end of the road, right on Circle St, right onto Appleatchee grounds.

From East: Over the arched Columbia River bridge (south), left on Mission St., right on Crawford St., left on Miller St, to end, right on Circle St, right onto Appleatchee grounds.
