I can't believe summer is almost over. We are looking forward to the last hoorah for the summer Labor Day Weekend roping, and hoping for a great turn out.

For the months of September and October we still will be jackpotting only on the 1st and 3rd Fridays. Starting in November we will be competing every Friday night.

The roping club will continue to practice every Tuesday and Thursday night at 7PM. The fee is only \$10 for members, and \$15 for non- members to practice. We would like to encourage everyone that is interested in exposing their horses to cattle, please to come join us.

We are having Team Sorting practice on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of each month through the summer months. Appleatchee members pay \$15 and non-members \$20. Practice starts at 6PM. The pens are now set up prior to that, so practice begins at 6:00 for sure. Everyone gets a full 2 minutes in the pen sorting, with a minimum of 3 times each. TEAM SORTING



We had a fun August jackpot sorting and third event in the summer buckle series. We had a fair turnout of 14 riders and paid out \$540 to winning teams in the 3-man and 2-man events. Half of the riders were from out of town. It is nice to have new riders, but where have all our local sorters gone?!

So far, Kevin Dunham (128 points), Sonja Ragan (124), and Brock Ragan (121) are maintaining their leads for the 1st division buckle. Go to the Appleathee website for all the scores. You earn points (based on cows sorted) at each competition. The summer buckle competition runs from June through October. If you miss an event you can still earn points and compete, plus earn jackpot cash at each event.

Come on down September 10 for the next monthly sorting to have some fun and take home some cash! We start at 10 AM with the usual 3-man 3-go (\$30) jackpot sorting. All 3-man teams are drawn. After the 3-man, we have the 2-man 6-go competition (\$60, plus \$5 arena fee for non-members). Teams are 2 picked partners and 4 drawn. Top teams in the upper and lower divisions (“2D format” based on team scores) qualify for a 2nd go competing against teams in your division. Winners in each division are determined by the sum of cows sorted (in clean runs) in the qualifying

and final goes. Payout is 50% of entry fees in both events. You can find a flier with all the dates on the website or on our FB page *Appleatchee Riders Team Sorting*.

We practice outdoors in the roping arena on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month at 6 PM. We are making it easier to practice this summer by having the grounds crew setup the pens so they are ready when we arrive. That means we start sooner, and can practice with fewer than 10 riders, thus avoiding cancelation. We still need to mark cattle and take the pens down. Cost is \$15 (+\$5 arena fee for non-members). If you are going to arrive late (6:15 or later) for whatever reason, send me a text message at 509 669-7373 so I know you are coming and can include you when I make teams.

Jill Seely Clinic: September 17 & 18 If you want a spot, you will need to pay a 50% deposit 2 weeks ahead of the clinic. In other words, if you are only riding once, then a non-refundable \$35 deposit will be due. It is refundable with a vet's certificate OR there may be a replacement rider for your spot. If you have scheduled for 2 rides, then a \$70 non-refundable deposit will be due. If the clinician needs to cancel for some reason then everyone gets a full refund.
