We need to keep the barns neat and in good repair.

TEAM SORTING



We had another great competition during February with 26 riders competing in 3-man and 2-man sorting. We paid out \$1065 to winning riders! Next up will be 3-man jackpot sorting and 2-man jackpot sorting at the last event in the winter prize series on March 10. In addition to earning points for the series prizes (buckles etc.), you

can win jackpot cash at each event, so come on down even if you are not in the prize series. Let me know if you need stalls or camping, otherwise just come and sort. The 4H riders will be providing lunch on March 10, so bring along some lunch money and support our 4H riders.

Want to ride in a first-class 2-man sorting clinic with top clinician Roger Braa? Yep, we have Roger coming again on June 23 for a 1-day clinic. Roger travels from his Kittitas valley home all over the country and Canada giving clinics. All levels of riders are encouraged to come—especially new riders to come and learn the game. You will get tons of time sorting cattle and with personal coaching. We also might follow the next day on Sunday with a fun drawpot sorting for clinic riders to use the skills they learned, and for anyone else interested in some sorting fun. Look for a flier with details to be posted soon.

We practice on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month at 6 PM. We've been having great turnouts with about 20+ riders the past month – mostly WAHSET riders getting ready for competition. Practice sessions are a great time to see if you like the sport or to test out a horse – we'll help you get going with coaching. The riding season is coming up fast, so get yourself and horse prepared. Cost is \$15 (+\$5 arena fee for non-members) for at least 3 goes (4 if there is a small crowd and we have time). Please arrive at 6 PM to help setup the pen and mark cattle; the crew will take down the pen the next day. The faster we get the pen up, the earlier we sort and can get more riding done!


